#### **Course Overview**

The Physics and Climate Physics Degree Pathway focuses on understanding climate change from a rigorous-science perspective, learning about the causes and effect of climate change, and the technology to monitor changes in our climate system. Studying this pathway will equip students with the skills and knowledge to apply a deep understand of physics concepts and emerging technology to the design and implementation of effective climate solutions.

This Institute of Physics accredited pathway consists of core physics modules throughout, supported by a strong foundation in chemistry, earth and ocean sciences.

## **Career Opportunities**

A degree in physics is an excellent basis for employment in high technology industries (e.g., communications, electronics, optics and photonics, semiconductors, and medical devices) and also within the second- and third-level education sectors, meteorology and the environmental and medical sciences, finance, and software design.

The Physics and Climate Physics degree pathway offers and excellent opportunity for students to apply their advanced scientific training to climate and environmental solutions including earth system monitoring, satellite remote sensing, and environmental risk management.
